To help our students grow in a balanced and beautiful environment, we employ almost 320 dedicated faculty members in a beautiful campus of about 17500 square meters. Our facilities are aimed to serve a holistic education that goes beyond this brochure:

- •2 swimming pools (one for younger children and one for the older)
- Two science labs allow students hands-on experience in the practicalities of theory;
- A 700 square meter multipurpose gymnasium and a ballet room provide excellent facilities for team sports, fitness, and the expressive arts, promoting a body/mind integration so important to health and happiness;
- A developed and well-equipped observatory
- A 20,000 m² private park and 3 yards that are designated for rest and play

While English, as a second language is used to discover mathematics, literature, or science, and provides an opportunity for children to enrich their minds with alternate understandings of the world. This open-mindedness is further developed by the acquisition of French/German, while the students' potential for creative expression is expanded in a modern approach to literacy that insists on the importance of other forms of literacy including art or computers.

Self-evaluation and qualitative assessment complete our curriculum dedicated to self-knowledge, critical thinking, and creativity. It is therefore during these years that the foundations for life-long learning are built and children learn ways to adapt themselves with our constantly changing world.
